Guest Speakers – Bush Tucker Babies

A very special treat for WFGC with Guest Speakers Kippy and Jesse, Bush Tucker Babies.

Kipper and Jesse delighted members with their presentation. Theses two young people are a reassurance and as Guest Speaker Coordinator, Carol Conway, stated in her words of thanks "Our Future is in good hands." The membership totally agreed!

Kippy and Jesse's journey began when they noticed that despite increasing awareness of the imminent need to "re-green" the planet, the knowledge of the general population on how to do so while supporting existing ecosystems could be quite hard to access.

Australian food plants have been largely ignored by contemporary society and although there is a recent boom in the promotion of Australian natives, this has resulted in Bushfoods being viewed as almost exotic – with the price tag to match!

Kippy and Jesse showed our members that native and local food plants have a place in every Australian garden and on every Australian table.

What an overview they presented! Tables of plants. Each plant taken around so the members could touch, feel and smell. As Jesse moved around Kippy and Jesse presented a depth of information on each plant noting suitability for BM gardening and nutritional details.

A few examples of the plants presented:

- Mountain Pepper (Tasmannia lanceolata) peppery tasting, grind as pepper, hot taste. male and female needed for fruit. Doesn't take extreme sun.
- Strawberry Gum (Eucalyptus Olinda) use as a flavour enhancer, used in perfume industry, can grown metres high, prune as a shrub in the garden.
- Lemon Myrtle Not suitable for BM. Cool tolerant. Use fresh or dried. Infuse in curry, iced teas. Tip prune.
- Desert Limes (citrus glauca) finger size fruit displayed on bush, perfect for cookies, iced teas and curries.
- Mountain Devil (Lambertia Formosa) flower nectar can be squeezed on pancakes, native bird food. Cold tolerant.
- Bunya Nut. Cold tolerant. 50 nuts in each Bunya, good source of protein.

Bush Tucker Babies website is an easy and informative browse. Includes plants, herbs and freeze -dried fruits.

Kippy and Jesse indeed showed us "native and local food plants have a place in every Australian garden and on every Australian plate." Well done, Bush Tucker Babies!
