Merilyn's Garden


It's mid-Spring and while very few of us will ever forget 2020 as being the year of the COVID-19 pandemic and its consequences, it's hard not to be optimistic when surrounded by all the new life and colour that Spring always brings. And, of course, not all of those pandemic consequences were entirely detrimental. One happy consequence, at least for me, especially during the lockdown period, was that I was able to spend more time in my garden without any sense of guilt that I should be doing other things – utter bliss! I love my garden. While it could never compete in beauty and excellence with the wonderful gardens we see in the garden festival, it is always such a pleasure to stroll through it each day (weather permitting), even though it means having to face all the things that need to be done – weeding, dead-heading, pruning, fertilising, mulching etc., etc. – it's endless! But suddenly I will notice something emerging from the soil that I had completely forgotten about, or those buds that seem to have been buds for so long, finally become flowers, or lovely new growth manages to transform a previously very sad-looking plant. I love all the surprises my garden constantly gifts to me.

When we came here almost eight years ago there was a well-established garden with nicely laid out beds and gravel paths between them. I waited for a year to see what each season was going to produce and then I let loose! The result is that I now have an area at the front where I have planted a variety of natives, and at this time of year the native mint bush is like a purple cloud and the waratahs, both red and white, are always impressive. Most of the bulbs have finished but some tulips are hanging on and the petite hooped petticoat daffodils and bluebells are also still giving much pleasure. The ephemeral beauty of the weeping cherries has been blown away – such a shame that this time of year seems to be when we get a lot of wind so the blossoms last such a short time before they become confetti on the ground. The Japanese rose (Kerria japonica) has been glorious – such a strong yellow – it lights up the whole garden. Now it's time for the azaleas and rhododendrons to take over, and the irises are coming out too. Clematis, cornflowers, poppies, foxgloves, lupins and delphiniums are growing and budding up and will become the next highlight in my ever-changing, cherished garden – it has brought so much pleasure in an awful year.
