The Wow Factor of Hydrangeas

There's something delightfully old-fashioned about hydrangeas, and they are a useful shrub for shady spots in the garden. The colour trick is either lime for pink flowers, or aluminium sulphate (called blueing tonic) for purple and blue flowers. Start the above feeding in autumn, then until buds have formed in early summer.
