The owner is Gil Teague and he has been running this business since 1989. He has over 5000 different titles across all aspects of gardening, including design, individual plants, environmental issues, botany, plant hunting, and growing food.

David Fripp grew up and worked for his parents on a stone fruit orchard in Peats Ridge, NSW. As a teenager he worked for his aunt, Elaine Slade, in her fern nursery, furthering his passion for plants. After leaving school early he set about becoming self-employed as a flower grower. Moving his skills to Sydney, he then began his own garden maintenance business in the eastern suburbs, where he lived until 1994. "Screen Trees Australia" began later that year and continues to supply landscapers and the general public with a range of hedging trees and, more recently, rarer and unusual plants, under the name "Living Edge Nursery". With his partner, David also presents and sells some of the more obscure plants at garden shows and clubs across the east coast and outer Sydney, according to climate, water availability and soil conditions. David has extensive knowledge on a wide variety of subjects and is quite happy to engage and answer any questions from garden club members.
